First Fridays at Notre Dame

Origins

First Fridays began in Flanner Hall in June 2019 as a means of raising awareness on the work of the Office of Digital Learning while simultaneously providing a space for those working in the building to meet their co-habitants. Owing to the popularity and success of the First Friday format, these events have expanded beyond Flanner Hall to the wider campus.

Goals

- 1. To heighten awareness of the services offered by the hosting body through an informal "open house" format
- 2. To provide faculty, staff, and graduate students from disparate offices, departments, centers, and institutes across Notre Dame with a space to meet thus encouraging cross-unit and cross-departmental conversations and collaborations.

Potential Impact

- Increased awareness of the services offered by the hosting body
- Increased use of services provided by the host
- Instigate cross departmental / cross-unit conversations and collaborations

Expectations of the Host

- 1. Create a calendar invite for the event and invite those included on the <u>First Friday mailing</u> list. The host is welcome to invite others not included on the list.
- 2. If desired, advertise the First Friday event campus wide and/or to targeted populations (for example, via the Week@ND, mailing lists, etc.)
- 3. Prepare the office space(s) to accommodate approximately 50 people.
- 4. If desired, prepare any informational materials they wish to have available at the event.
- 5. If desired, deliver a short welcome announcement with a 2-5min overview of the host's services, etc.
- 6. Provide light snacks and beverages (typically alcoholic and non-alcoholic) for approximately 50 people. The extravagance of the event is left to the host's discretion.
